Dear Friends and Supporters,

A recent *Wall Street Journal* opinion entitled, "Biden's Second-Term Mistake" succinctly stated what we all know: "... electing an octogenarian in obvious decline for another four years could be an historic mistake... It's impossible to know Mr. Biden's real physical and mental state because the White House goes to great lengths to hide it. But his decline is clear to anyone who isn't willfully blind...
